
The EcoFair Trade Dialogue

Last summer the WTO negotiations collapsed due to irreconcilable positions in the area of agriculture. Over all, the prevailing conflicts about the reduction of tariffs and subsidies have to do with diverging interests between countries and economic players with strong trade interests. But the livelihood conditions of the rural poor or the environmental and social consequences of industrial agriculture are not taken into account.

In view of this situation, the Heinrich Böll Foundation and MISEREOR, in cooperation with the Wuppertal Institute, have initiated a comprehensive North-South dialogue process which has developed reform proposals towards a forward-looking, socially and ecologically just and sustainable agricultural trade system.

The publication **Slow Trade – Sound Farming** is the first main result of the EcoFair Trade Dialogue which has included in its debate a significant number of representatives from NGOs, farmers' organizations, governments, parliaments, international organizations and research institutions. At the conference on April 24, the results of this dialogue will be presented to the interested German and European public and discussed with international guests in different panels and forums.
